In communities across the country, non-profit, public access sailing and boating programs are making learning to sail and recreational boating affordable and accessible to ordinary folks.

The Community Boating Center (CBC) at Providence's India Point Park opened in June 1994 with a small fleet, a few docks, and a boat shed built with donated materials and volunteer labor. CBC is a true grass-roots success story. Organized and implemented entirely by volunteers, the visionary plan that the people of Rhode Island should have access to a thriving community boating program was set into action.

Today, our boathouse, 60+ sailboats, kayaks, SUPs, and dedicated membership, positions CBC as an integral component to the success and growth of Providence's waterfront revival. Founded as a non-profit 501(c)3 charitable organization, CBC offers a variety of opportunities that allow the public to experience the thrill of sailing and boating in upper Narragansett Bay.

Community Outreach

Each year children eager to get outside and targeted by CBC efforts, experienced our outreach programs. These children are primarily recruited through liaisons with structured organizations in the greater Providence area. Boys and girls from different cultures and backgrounds work together, learning tolerance, trust and respect for one another. Most importantly, these kids can continue to enjoy sailing and paddling because CBC makes it accessible and affordable.

Sailing & Paddling Lessons

CBC offers a variety of youth & adult sailing/paddling lessons that allow members to experience the thrill and challenge of sailing/paddling in upper Narragansett Bay. "Sailorships" are available for youth who meet eligibility requirements. Affordable CBC memberships allow individuals and groups to enroll in our structured lessons including FREE access to our boats for adults to continue to enjoy sailing/paddling as a lifetime recreational activity upon lesson completion.

Affordable Access

CBC also offers affordable sailing and paddling access for experienced adults who do not wish to take lessons. Qualified members may sail or kayak during open boating hours subject to weather/ equipment availability. CBC also provides access and fleet rentals to local schools. Additionally, CBC offers waterfront function room rental for meetings, parties, or special events.

- Youth After-School Sailing & Paddling Season runs 5/20 - 6/13 (spring) & 9/09 -10/03 (fall)
- Youth Summer EcoAdventure and Sailing Camps run from 6/17 - 8/16.
- Adult Summer Lesson Season runs from 5/28 - 9/26.
- Experienced adults may take a checkout test to qualify to sail or paddle boats in our fleet.
- Qualified adults (& friends) may sail or kayak during open boating — at no additional cost.
- Paddleboard lessons and rentals are available from 6/21 - 10/04, 4:00 - 7:00 pm.
- Adult recreational sailing/kayaking runs 5/28-10/13, 1-7 pm Sat & Sun, 4-7 pm Mon-Thurs.
- All open boating hours are subject to weather, availability, and program usage.

Note – Inclement Weather Considerations (all CBC youth programs):

We all know it's not easy running a summer camp but we're thrilled to get your children out of the house and on-the-water. When the sun is shining, sailing/paddling in the Ocean State is hard to beat. However, all-day storm events can be challenging for our indoor capacity. If you can keep your child home on bad weather days (forecast at least a day ahead) we would appreciate your flexibility in helping us reduce the number of youth on-site. We understand this is not ideal, & may not be possible for some families, but appreciate your help & understanding.

Adult fees for our paddleboard lessons and rentals are used to purchase more paddleboards that enable us to serve additional youth – at one-tenth to one-twentieth of the cost of adding a similar number of sailboats to our fleet. Additionally, with your help we hope to realize further growth in our paddling programs with our summer and after-school partners.

CBC is a 501(c)3 non-profit offering outreach, lessons, and affordable access to Narragansett Bay. Adults join as a member, take lessons (or challenge test), sail and kayak all season for no extra fee, and take family (age 5+) FREE! Youth sail in supervised classes or events.

Do You Offer Financial Assistance?

"Sailorships" are available for all CBC youth programs. Get a separate application form (required) at www.communityboating.com or CBC.

How Do I Sign Up For Lessons?

Anyone can join. You don't need any experience to take our Beginner classes. Experienced sailors may choose our more advanced classes.

How Do I Take A Challenge Test?

A skills checkout test is required for each boat class you wish to use. The test is required of all members to participate in CBC open sailing or paddling. Tests given weekends, in-season, 1:30, 3:30, & 5:30 pm.

How Do I Get To Community Boating Center By Car?

We are located at 109 India Street, Providence (India Point Park)
From I-95 North – Take exit 19, I-195 East
From I-95 South – Take exit 20, I-195 East

From I-195 East

- Take exit 1A (old exit 2), India Street
- Turn right onto India Street (follow sign to "Boating Ctr.")
- CBC is first building on left. (green roof, raised pilings)

From I-195 West

- Take exit 1C (old exit 2), South Main St.
- Turn left onto Pike Street (immediate)
- Turn left onto South Water St. - Stay in right lane under highway
- Turn left onto India Street
- CBC is next building on right. (green roof, raised pilings)

How Do I Get To CBC By Bus Or Trolley?

- Take Bus #34 or Green Line Trolley #92 to Wickenden St.
- Walk over India Point footbridge to India Point Park
- At park, turn right, walk .1 miles. (CBC is first building on water)

Can My Child Arrive By Launch Or On A Bicycle?

Parents/guardians are required to fill out the Child Pickup Authorization on the application and may indicate if a child will be arriving/departing other than by car, or by someone other than the parent/guardian.

Do You Sail If It's Raining?

Classes are held in all kinds of weather - even rain. In the event of a threat of severe storm or hurricane, class participants will be called at home, and informed of the decision to cancel class.

What If I'm Late Or Sick?

Please call 401-454-SAIL (7245) and let us know you will be late or out for the day, so that the class Instructor can be informed.

What if I Have Special Needs Or Medications?

Please indicate special needs, learning differences, or medication(s) on your application. You may also speak with the Director or Instructor with concerns or input to ensure a positive experience at CBC.

Who Should I Talk To With A Concern Or Issue?

The class Instructor should be your first stop for resolving daily issues. Serious concerns may be brought to the Director. The best time to talk is at the end of class. Otherwise, please call to schedule a follow-up.

What If My Child Is Reluctant To Come To Class?

Fear, an incident with a classmate, or simply being tired can affect a student's drive to attend class. Our instructors are trained to help motivate students to get out on the water and have fun. Ask us to help.

What If My Child Gets Hurt?

Any time an instructor administers first aid, an injury report will be completed. A slip indicating the nature of the injury and the treatment that was given will be sent home with the student.

How Does The CBC Rating System Work?

CBC has developed a rating system to ensure that each member participating in recreational boating is qualified to handle the appropriate boat and weather conditions commensurate with his/her sailing experience. CBC uses on-the-water checkout tests and a visual, green/ red flag system to indicate daily sailing and paddling conditions on the water.

What Are The CBC Adult Sailing Skill Levels?

Our standardized skill levels ensure that you get the most from your sailing experience. CBC instructors will evaluate your skill level and help refine your personal sailing plan. Once confident and capable in skills required of each category, you will be recommended to advance to the next level.

1 – Green, Beginner

Our "green" beginners respect the power of the wind and know the basic skills of sailing. This level requires proficiency in safety, seamanship and boat handling in winds to 6 knots velocity. Students must demonstrate skills in nomenclature, rigging, sail handling, and steering a course.

2 – Blue, Intermediate

Intermediate sailors have a deep respect for the ocean blue. They have reinforced basics and continue to master the skills of upwind sailing, proper docking and sailing a triangular course. Includes special privileges required to sail with a jib and for extended range sailing at CBC.

3 – Yellow, Advanced

Advanced CBC sailors focus on theory, advanced trim, docking, and safety techniques on performance boats designed to challenge even the most advanced sailing appetite. This higher learning achievement offers the coveted privilege to sail CBC performance sailboats.

4 – Orange, Instructor

Teaching is the ultimate way to give back to the sport. Sailing is for all kinds of people – not just racers. Those who share their passion for wind and sea and master the mechanics of a complex sailing vessel are rewarded with a new sense of self worth and pride in accomplishment.

5 – Red, Racer

Friendly, fun, and fast racing is the best way to advance boat-handling skills and learn from others. Racers can demonstrate starts, tactical tips, and winning strategies to relish competitive sailing as a lifelong interest.

What is the Green/ Red Flag System?

A green flag indicates that no restrictions are present and that members may sail or paddle according to the level and boat they have previously qualified in.

A red flag indicates that there are restrictions currently present due to weather or equipment limitations. Each member must check the posted restrictions prior to sailing or paddling. Less experienced members may not be permitted to sail or paddle on some red flag days.

Common restrictions include cancellation due to high wind or waves, or limits to the open boating area due to weather or boat traffic. Please understand that these restrictions are designed for your safety. If you have questions, please ask the dock staff how to best enjoy your next experience. We want you on the water as much as you want to be there!

What Is Your Cancellation Policy?

Membership fees are non-refundable. Class cancellations received prior to two weeks before the start of class and filled with other applicants will incur a \$30 administrative fee and the remaining balance will be refunded. Class attendees will not be reimbursed for missed classes.

What Types Of Boats Do You Use?

Our current fleet consists of a broad range of boats designed to make sailing & boating fun and affordable for our varied instructional classes and membership interests. CBC instructors will evaluate the skills and experience of each student, considering factors like size and agility, in determining which boat and group is most appropriate for you.

CBC instructors typically teach onboard beginner sailboats until students have progressed to a point where they can teach from a safety/powerboat. Advanced classes allow instructors to encourage independence by teaching from safety/powerboats almost exclusively.

Paddleboards

Our 11' BIC SUPs offer an ultra-stable platform equally suited for first-timers, family fun, fitness, yoga, or whatever your next SUP adventure may be. The unique 'hybrid' design features a keeled nose for excellent tracking and full rail-to-rail volume for enhanced stability.

Kayaks

Our sit-on-top kayaks offer great stability, ease of use, and minimal training to get you or your family out on the water fast. With no enclosed cockpit, paddlers do not need to learn the "Eskimo roll" or worry about pumping out accumulated water after an accidental flip. Sit-on-tops are the preferred choice of beginner paddling programs.

RS Quest

The 14' RS Quest was developed specifically as a training boat. It features a self-draining cockpit and a super-stable hull to give maximum security and safety. It feels considerably bigger than its size with a large cockpit for up to four - great for training and family sailing.

RS Zest

The 11' RS Zest delivers the stability of a much larger boat. Easy to single hand for adults, with room for 2-3 youth, the RS Zest is an ideal solution for camps, club programs, and families. This is a boat to get kids & adults onto the water and into the wonderful world of sailing.

Laser Pico

The Laser Pico is a fun, durable, confidence inspiring, roto-molded boat that can be sailed by everyone. It's ideal for entry-level sailors and is equipped with a removable jib and reefing main sail for easy rigging.

Hobie Wave

The Hobie Wave is an easy- to-sail, easy-to-rig speedster that will have you smiling. Fun for the family and exciting for the juniors while forgiving enough for the newly initiated, the Hobie Wave is the ideal must-go-sailing-now catamaran.

Laser & Laser Radial

The 14' Laser is the most popular single-handed, one-design dinghy. The Laser class was built on the philosophy that the sailor wins the race, not the boat. The Laser Radial uses a smaller sail for smaller sailors who don't quite have the size to handle a full Laser rig.

Hunter 216 Keelboat

The 22' Hunter 216 features a large cockpit for maximum crew comfort and allows easy access to effortless hydraulic lifting of a 500 lb. keel. Due to fully booked scheduling, H216 keelboats are used in our youth outreach programs only.

Maine Cat 30 Catamaran

"Sundance" serves as the flagship for use in our inner-city outreach programs and adult catamaran classes. This "outdoor classroom" was generously donated by CBC supporters who recognized the potential of the vessel to change the lives of CBC youth sailors.

Expectations

CBC has developed rules and procedures to help ensure a safe, rewarding, and fun learning environment. It is important that you review these rules. Appropriate behavior is expected at all times. Failure to observe the rules and procedures will result in sanctions that vary according to the nature of the infraction, but can include loss of sailing and/or paddling privileges and/ or expulsion. Verbal or physical abuse, or behavior that jeopardizes your safety or that of anyone else in the program, will result in a written warning. A second incident will constitute a brief suspension from the program. An additional incident will result in an extended suspension or dismissal from the remainder of the season without refund of tuition or membership fee.

Be Safe, Be Responsible

Sailing and paddling involve potential hazards inherent to all water sports. Anyone going out in a boat must understand the associated risks and assume full responsibility for their actions on the water. CBC staff has the right to limit any part of the program, or close it completely at any time, if the safety of members may be threatened. CBC also has the right to revoke any sailing, paddling, or membership privileges for violation of these rules. If you feel you have been treated unfairly, or that a staff member has shown poor judgment, you may discuss it later with him/her, the Director, or Board. At the time, however, you must comply with his/her request.

Plan Your Trip – Know Your Limits

CBC's location serves as an ideal geographical hub for expanding water-based activities that connect you to the environment. CBC is located in India Point Park, the apex of Narragansett Bay. Buffered by geographical land features of the upper bay, CBC enjoys unique protection from wind and wave action for small boats and is perfectly situated as a centrally located starting/end point for paddling trips.

CBC offers safe, fun, and viable paddling distances North/South to WaterPlace Park and West/East to the Seekonk River. Beginner paddlers and volunteers appreciate the convenience and safety of realistic paddling distances on weary arms, while seasoned paddlers can choose multiple trip options from a safe, convenient facility with launching docks, chase boats and trained staff. CBC paddle maps are available at the boathouse.

Electronics

Do not bring unprotected (non-waterproof) cell phones, electronic devices, cameras or valuables sailing or paddling. CBC is not responsible for lost, immersed, or stolen gear.

CBC Equipment

All equipment must be inspected prior to each sail or paddle. Familiarize yourself with wind and weather conditions and how your boat should be rigged to accommodate them. Please keep in mind the ever-present hazard of the swinging boom or paddle. Watch your head! Accidents or collisions resulting in damage/ injury must be reported immediately. You must also inspect your boat after sailing or paddling and report broken/ worn equipment. Do not drag sails or gear on the dock, floor, or grass. Boats must be bailed and free of litter.

Weather

Storms may approach very quickly up Narragansett Bay. Keep a close eye on weather conditions. If it feels as though a storm may be approaching, or the wind suddenly gets stronger, return at once. Always check weather conditions prior to leaving dock.

Concerns & Issues

The class Instructor or Dock Master should be your first stop for resolving most issues. He/ she is the day-to-day facilitator, and usually has the answer and ability to make decisions and correct problems. Serious concerns should be brought to the attention of the Program Coordinator. The best time to talk to the Instructor is at the end of class. If this is not convenient, please call and leave a message asking that someone follow-up with you.

Parent/ Guardian Involvement

We need your help to reinforce all the positive aspects of your child's experience at CBC. Talking with your child about his/ her class experience is a great opportunity to share newly learned skills and build a dialog that:

- Offers support and encouragement
- Reinforces learned skills
- Increases confidence and self-esteem
- Addresses problems or issues in a timely manner
- Allows you to share in the joy & thrill of learning to sail & paddle

Sailing and paddling are challenging sports that encourage and require a healthy lifestyle. Help us prepare your child for a full day on the water with these simple, important guidelines that will help sailors and paddlers alike to learn properly, and enjoy their experience: Please Bring:

- Good Health – Don't come if you're sick
- Lifejacket – USCG Type III (limited, assigned PFDs available)
- Backpack or duffel (labeled with name)
- Hand sanitizer
- Reusable water bottle – filled (no plastic, single-use bottles!)
- Sunscreen (not to be shared)
- Healthy, non-perishable lunch (all trash is pack-in/pack-out)
- Closed-toe shoes (no bare feet or flip-flops)
- Sunglasses, hat, and other sun protection
- Layered clothes for cooler temperatures on the water
- Change of dry clothes and a towel
- Don't bring jewelry, electronics, or anything that you value
- CBC is not responsible for lost, immersed or stolen items

CBC has developed rules and procedures to help ensure a safe, rewarding, and fun learning environment. It is important that you and your child review these guidelines. Appropriate behavior is expected at all times.

1. Listen to adults at all times.
2. Use kind words.
3. Always stay in the cockpit or onboard while sailing or paddling.
4. No rough play! (It is unsafe.)
5. Be helpful to your crew (rigging and de-rigging the boat!)
6. Keep your hands in the boat and to yourself!
7. No throwing the gravel on the land.
8. Do not go onto the dock or boat without your life jacket.
9. Your life jacket must be zipped & clipped.
10. HAVE FUN!

Verbal or physical abuse, or behavior that jeopardizes your child's safety or that of anyone else in the program will not be tolerated. Failure to observe rules & procedures will result in sanctions that vary according to the nature of the infraction, but can include loss of boating privileges and/or expulsion. All students will be accountable to the following three-step system:

Step 1 - This step is a first warning. Parents will be notified of the incident and will receive a written note describing the details.

Step 2 - At the second step, a discussion will be held with parents. The student will receive a brief suspension from the program. The student and parents will also be reminded that a third step could result in a suspension from the rest of the session.

Step 3 - At the third step, a meeting will be called with the Director. The student will receive an extended suspension from the program, possibly suspension for the remainder of the session. You will not be refunded your payment in this situation.

Recreational Boating Rules

Wear Your Life Jacket & Shoes

Everyone is required to wear a personal flotation device (PFD) which is Coast Guard approved, the proper size for weight and build, and form-fitting and comfortable, as it will be worn at all times. Closed-toe shoes (no flip-flops) will also be worn at all times in boats and on the docks/site.

CBC Sailing & Paddling Areas

Separate areas have been designated for sailing and paddling at CBC. These activity-specific zones must be obeyed as marked on the CBC master chart. Members must be familiar with the local waters as there are many obstructions to contend with. Feel free to ask a staff member if you are not sure of open sailing or paddling areas. Boating time may be restricted upon demand - maximum limit upon restriction is two hours.

Open, Recreational Sailing & Paddling Use

Instructional programs have priority for boat use. Members may use boats not used in classes during open boating hours per staff approval. Use of a jib on any boat requires two (2) sailors for weight distribution and control. We encourage you to sail with other family members or friends to build a community of networked sailors. Family/friend sailing guests (number appropriate for boat type) may join you for FREE. Members & (1) guest may use up to two (2) kayaks per visit.

On-the-Water Evaluation

A checkout test is required of all members to participate in recreational sailing and paddling. Members taking courses will learn the skills required for this evaluation. You will only be allowed to use the boat you have been pre-qualified in. Keelboats are not available for recreational use. Scheduled classes and private instruction are available to teach the proper skills required to handle each class of boat at CBC.

Guests

Qualified adult members may take out family/friend guests (age 5+) as often as they like at no charge provided boats are available. There must be a qualified adult member in each sailboat, or within immediate reach of each kayak. Each member and guest must sign the sign-out sheet. Members are responsible for their guests and for their safety. It is the obligation of members to know emergency procedures and to ensure that his/her guests are familiar with them prior to sailing or paddling.

Watch the American Flag

Beginners are required to stay within sight of the American flag at all times. In an emergency or should weather conditions deteriorate, the flag may be lowered to half-mast. You must return to the dock immediately if the flag is lowered to half-mast! CBC staff may revoke membership privileges or limit participation for violation of this very important rule.

Green/ Red Flag

A green flag indicates no restrictions are present and members may sail or paddle according to the level & boat they have previously qualified in.

A red flag indicates that there are restrictions currently present due to weather or equipment limitations. Each member must check the posted restrictions prior to sailing or paddling. Less experienced members may not be permitted to sail or paddle on some red flag days. Common restrictions include cancellation due to high wind or waves, or limits to the open boating areas due to weather or boat traffic.

Right Of Way – 50 Yard “Big Boat” Buffer Zone

Large motorboats (tankers, ferries, ships, etc.) limited in maneuverability always have the right of way. Give all ships a 50-yard min. buffer zone. Avoid collisions! Sailboats on port yield to starboard, windward yields to leeward, overtaking yields to overtaken. Avoid boats having trouble. Yield to fast rowing shells that are hard to see, and may not see you.

Miscellaneous Rules And Procedures

- No swimming or landing at other docks or shore.
- Stay clear of CBC dock when boats are landing.
- Do not litter the property, dock, boats, or river.
- Alcohol, controlled substances, and smoking are prohibited.
- No bikes, rollerblades, or pets are allowed near docks/ building.

Sailing Specific Tips

Running Aground

Stay in the boat! There are many underwater obstructions that you cannot see near shore. Some can cut right through your shoes. Raise your centerboard, lower your sail, or remove your rudder to free yourself from the obstruction. Give all shorelines a 50-yard min. buffer zone.

Man Overboard

If anyone falls out of the boat, watch his/her position constantly and return to pick him/her up immediately. It is difficult to find a person in the water once you have lost sight of him/ her.

Capsizing

Stay with the boat! Current can be very strong making swimming difficult. Do not try to swim to shore. All boats have flotation and won't sink even when full of water. Don't stand on top of a capsized boat, as your weight may force the mast into the mud. Speed is the key to recovery success.

Top Ten CBC Paddling Tips

One - ALWAYS Wear Your Life Jacket

Wear a properly fitting U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket at all times.

Two - Don't Drink While Paddling

Avoid alcohol – it impairs coordination and balance you need for control.

Three - Stay Low

Learn how to enter/exit your boat/board safely & stay low when possible.

Four - Keep Your Balance

Don't overload boat/board. Distribute passengers & gear evenly & low.

Five - Practice the Wet Exit (kayaks)

Learn how to get out of, hang on to, right, and re-enter a capsized boat. The best self-rescue technique for sit-on-tops is BBF- Belly, Butt, Feet. Pull the kayak under you, and stabilize yourself on the kayak: first on your belly, then your butt, and finally your feet.

Six - Don't Get Left in the Cold

Dress for the weather conditions and be prepared for coldwater immersion. Hypothermia is a danger any time of year.

Seven - Plan Ahead

Know the water you're paddling, plan your day of paddling, and file a "float plan" so we know where to find you and when you plan to return.

Eight - Never Paddle Alone

Companions can come to your aid if you get in trouble. New paddlers should paddle with someone more experienced — it's a great way to learn and remain safe if there's a mishap.

Nine - Be in Command

Know how to move your boat/board forward, back, & sideways, & how to stop using paddle strokes. Watch ahead for hazards like undercut rocks, bridge pilings, large branches and trees, big drop-offs, or other boats.

Ten - Learn About Your Boat/Board

Know your skill level and avoid weather or water conditions that exceed your skill. Consider taking a kayak or paddleboard safety class.

Miscellaneous CBC Paddling Tips

- Constantly scan for potential hazards and changing weather.
- Set a reasonable pace so everyone can stay together.
- Recognize when members of your group are tired or having difficulty and adjust pace accordingly.
- Look out for everyone in the group. Designate a "sweep" boat/board to bring up the rear & make sure you don't lose stragglers.
- Communicate effectively on the water. Wind and water sounds can make hearing others difficult. Whistles and hand signals can help.
- Always be prepared for the unexpected flip or dunk.
- Sun and wind can be very dehydrating – make sure you drink water.
- Have Fun!
